TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR CLEANING AND HYGIENE SERVICES

1. INTRODUCTION

The South African Health Products Regulatory Authority (SAHPRA / The Authority) is the regulatory authority responsible for the regulation of health products intended for human and animal use, the conduct of clinical trials, as well as the licensing of manufacturers, wholesalers, and distributors of medicines and medical devices, radiation emitting devices, and radioactive nuclides.

The legislative mandates of SAHPRA are derived from the Medicines and Related Substances Act, 1965 (Act No. 101 of 1965), as amended (herein after referred to as “the Medicines Act”), and other relevant legislation, regulations, and policies.

In terms of the Medicines Act, the objectives of the Authority are to provide for the monitoring, evaluation, regulation, investigation, inspection, registration, and control of medicines, scheduled substances, clinical trials, medical devices, and radiation emitting devices, and related matters that are in the public’s interest.

SAHPRA transitioned into a public entity on 1 February 2018. Previously, the Authority was known as the Medicines Control Council (MCC), a sub-programme of the National Department of Health (NDOH).

SAHPRA charges fees for various services rendered in terms of its mandate. These fees are gazetted, and applicants pay fees prior to submission of application. Payment received are allocated in a clearing account (unallocated) until matched to an application where it’s added to the deferred income / income received in advance listing. Revenue is recognised on service rendered.

2. PURPOSE

SAHPRA invites licensed telecommunications service providers (holders of both Electronic Communications Services (ECS) and Electronic Communications Network Services (ECNS) licenses (hereafter referred to as “Service Providers”) for implementation of MPLS or SD-WAN , Internet solution and Mobile Data for SAHPRA’s main office in Pretoria and satellite office in Cape Town and Durban.

The contract period shall be for a maximum of thirty-six (36) months.

3.1 Implementation of a Wide Area Network (WAN), i.e., Multi- Protocol Label Switching (MPLS) network or Software Defined Wan (SD-WAN), Internet Services and Mobile Data.

3.2 Provide WAN connectivity through a secure MPLS/SD-WAN between three (03) SAHPRA Offices for a period of thirty-six (36) months:

- Pretoria – Head Office
- Cape Town – Branch Office
- Durban – Branch Office

3.3 Connectivity between Branch Offices should be via Head Office.

3.4 Bandwidth requirements for WAN connectivity between SAHPRA Offices:

3.5 Provide SAHPRA with a dedicated internet breakout connectivity service securely managed through a hosted firewall\application with advanced monitoring, security, traffic filtering and performance-enhancing protocols. With a fixed public IP Address for SAHPRA Head Office allowing VPN connectivity to all SAHPRA Offices. Each SAHPRA Office should have independent Internet breakout.

3.7 Provide WAN and Internet connectivity infrastructure with redundancy architecture and automatic failover for SAHPRA Offices:

- 3.8 Provide SAHPRA with public IP addresses (20), security and flexibility allowing SAHPRA to internally host public facing services with ease through known standard protocols and ports such as websites, FTP etc.
- 3.9 Perform pre- and post-installation inspections to verify that installation requirements are met.
- 3.10 Provide infrastructure needed to maintain 99.99% uptime.
- 3.11 Make provision for redundancy and high availability on the core WAN network... This should be indicated clearly on what measures and controls will be taken and implemented.
- 3.12 Ensure software updates/upgrades (Router firmware & Line upgrade etc.) are performed on hardware at no extra cost to SAHPRA. All Upgrades/updates to be carried out in line with SAHPRA Change Control Policies.
- 3.13 The WAN Connections will make provision for transmission of data, voice, video, and transmission of all system data across SAHPRA.
- 3.14 Provide reliable and secure Internet connectivity.
- 3.15 The proposed services must be able to provide high-quality voice, high-definition videoconferencing, transactional applications, bulk data traffic and internet browsing.

- 3.18.1 The deliverables are the provisioning, installation, configuration, testing and support of the service listed the scope in section.
 - 3.18.2 The Service Provider is required to provide SAHPRA with a comprehensive project implementation plan and schedule, which indicate the project commencement and completion dates, duration, activities, milestones, deliverables, human resources, budget and risks. A project schedule shall not be mistaken for a project plan.
 - 3.18.3 The Service Provider shall assign a project manager to manage the project ensuing from the award of this bid as well as to manage the multi-disciplinary and multi-stakeholder project team that will be responsible for the implementation of the project. The Curriculum Vitae of all project team members shall be included in the bid documentation. Failure to abide by this will invalidate a bid.
 - 3.18.4 The service provider must ensure that the required deliverables during the project implementation are provided to the client and demonstrate the achievement of the desired outputs or outcomes within the constraints of the contracted time and resources. A penalty of 15% of the contract ceiling price inclusive of VAT will be charged for each day the project is overdue.
 - 3.18.5 The Service Provider shall be expected to establish a project management office in close proximity to the facility where the system will be piloted, tested, commissioned, or rolled out. Such costs shall be borne by the Service Provider.
 - 3.18.6 The provisioning, installation, configuration, testing and commissioning at each site shall be properly signed off by the Service Provider's project manager and the SAHPRA's delegate.
- 3.19 **ISP Migration/ Cutover** - The proposed project implementation and related deliverables should allow for ISP switch without any downtime. (NB Current ISP contract is due on the 31 May 2024)

4. SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT

- 4.1.1. The service must be operational within a month after the contract has been awarded.
- 4.1.2. A three (03) year Service Level Agreement will be required with 24/7 support on-site when needed for the entire contract period.

- ii. The minimum technical threshold is **75 points**. Bidders that do not meet the minimum technical threshold will not be evaluated further for price and specific goals.

b. PRICE AND SPECIFIC GOALS POINTS

- i. All remaining bids will be evaluated as follows:
- ii. The 80/20 preference point system will be applied. Points for price and specific goals will be awarded in accordance with the stipulations in the Preference Point Claim Form in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022.
